

# GRANTS ALERT March 24, 2022

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## Highlights

The U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) opened three grant opportunities, two of which are new, and each funded with monies provided by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL). The three are outlined in the **"Multimodal Project Discretionary Grant" (MPDG) Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO).** Applicants may apply for one, two or three grants with a single application. A series of webinars is scheduled, the first of which is Tues., March 29 at 1 p.m. EST (registration link). The deadline to apply for any of the grants is May 23, 2022.

- New -- Mega: \$1 billion for the National Infrastructure Project Assistance program;
- INFRA: \$1.55 billion for the Infrastructure for Rebuilding America program;
- **New** -- Rural: \$300 million for the Rural Surface Transportation Grant program.

U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Distressed Cities and Persistent Poverty Technical Assistance (DCTA) – by providing technical assistance (TA), this program helps small local governments improve financial management, improve internal processes and build program capacity. Additional areas considered for TA include "governance and management, leadership development, data and research, building partnerships, community engagement, strategic planning, plan implementation, and program evaluation." Eligibility is for 1) communities with less than 50,000 in population that are economically distressed (9% or more average unemployment over the last three years; a poverty rate of 20% or more of individuals not enrolled in higher education; or a population decline of 5% or more between 2010 Census and most recent ACS 5-year estimate) and/or 2) communities with less than 50,000 in population with one or more census tracts experiencing persistent poverty. U.S. Department of Transportation's (DOT) "Charging Forward: A Toolkit for Planning and Funding Rural Electric Mobility Infrastructure" -- The toolkit contains best practices for planning EV charging stations and tips to help navigate federal funding. The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) includes \$7.5 billion to build out a nationwide network of EV charging stations. Of these, \$4.75 billion will go to states, and \$2.5 billion will be allocated through a competitive grant process "that will support innovative approaches and ensure that charger deployment meets Administration priorities such as supporting rural charging, improving local air quality and increasing EV charging access in disadvantaged communities." ## Administrative Notes:

**Grants.gov Process**: Applicants to grants posted in the Grants.gov site have been required to register as an organization by obtaining a "DUNS" number. **That system is changing.** "In April 2022, the federal government will transition away from the use of the DUNS Number and toward the new Unique Entity ID (UEI) as the primary means of entity identification for federal awards government-wide." *New* -- **DOJ Grants Process:** Grant applicants to the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) system must complete a twopart process when applying for DOJ grants --- first, the application is begun in the Grants.gov system; second, the full application is completed in <u>JustGrants</u>. The DOJ provides an <u>application checklist</u> to help applicants with the process.
