The Energy Communities, or Interagency Working Group (IWG) on Coal and Power Plant Communities and Economic Revitalization (Interagency Working Group) launched a **public comment portal** in which public feedback is requested to help the federal working group prioritize and plan assistance to energy communities. Comments will be accepted until August 9, 2022. Submit comments, here.

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has published a <u>Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM)</u> on standards and requirements for projects funded under the **National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Formula Program**. Comments to the rule will be accepted until <u>August 22</u>, 2022.

The Joint Office of Energy and Transportation is accepting nominations for the **Electric Vehicle (EV) Working Group**, which will make recommendations regarding EV development, adoption and integration across the United States. Nominations for individuals working in the EV manufacturing, labor, public utility, tribal, trucking and other sectors are sought. The National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) published a set of **Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) on the three broadband funding opportunities** that are open for solicitation currently. FAQ on the <u>Broadband Equity, Access & Deployment Program (BEAD)</u>; FAQ on the <u>Digital Equity Act</u>; FAQ on the <u>Middle Mile</u> grant.

The U.S. Conference of Mayors, the National League of Cities (NLC) and Results for America announced a new **Local Infrastructure Hub** that will provide \$50 million to aid cities and towns in accessing billions in federal infrastructure funding. Through the hub, experts will provide "free coaching, data analysis and support" in helping applicants with their grant applications. The hub officially launches on July 12, 2022.
