The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) opened **Round 4 of the Reconnect Program** for high-speed internet on September 6, 2022. Funded through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), available funding includes up to \$150 million in loans, up to \$300 million in loan/grant combinations, and up to \$700 million in grants. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is seeking nominations for its **Local Government Advisory Committee (LGAC)** which advises EPA on environmental issues impacting local governments. It is also seeking nominations for the LGAC's Small Communities Advisory Subcommittee (SCAS). Candidates must be current elected officials or officials working full-time for a government who have been appointed directly by an elected official. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) updated and improved its <u>EJScreen</u>, the publicly available **environmental justice screening and mapping tool** that allows users to zoom in on a geographic area to see demographic socioeconomic and environmental information for that area. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) released the newly updated <u>State Energy and Environment Guide</u> <u>to Action</u> to help states design and implement policies that reduce emissions associated with electricity generation and energy consumption. The guide was first published in 2006 and last updated in 2015.

On September 27, 2022, the U.S. Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) approved the state of **North Carolina's EV Infrastructure Deployment Plan** which describes how the state intends to use its portion of the National EV Infrastructure (NEVI) formula program funds. The U.S Treasury Department and the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) issued six notices asking for **comments on different aspects of extensions and enhancements of energy tax benefits in the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA)** including credits on clean vehicles; energy security tax credits for manufacturing; incentive provisions for improving the energy efficiency of residential and commercial buildings; energy generation incentives; elective payments of applicable credits and transfer of certain credits; and prevailing wage, apprenticeship, domestic content and energy

communities requirements.
